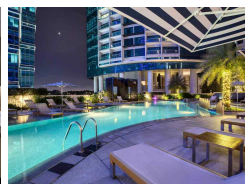
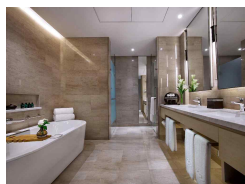
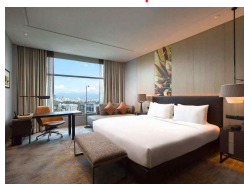

Genting Highlands - Malaysia's casino resort land, nicknamed Las Vegas above the clouds

Malaysia is the only country in the world with an Islamic culture that prohibits gambling, and it is also home to a variety of activities and entertainment, including theme parks, shopping, performances, and sports.

Genting Tourist Guide

Batu Caves - Giant stalactite cave

Just 13 kilometers north of Kuala Lumpur, you'll find the Batu Caves, a massive limestone cavern. Discovered in 1878, the caves surround exposed geological formations that appear to be over a million years old. There are 272 steps leading to the cave, representing the 272 sins of Hinduism. Hindus believe that ascending these steps will cleanse them of their sins, drawing a steady stream of visitors. The forests flanking the steps are home to numerous native wild monkeys, offering another fascinating attraction.



Monkey Hill

Monkey Hill, located in Selangor, is the remains of the Bukit Melawati Fort, an 18th-century Sultanate stronghold. While officially called "Melawati Hill," it's nicknamed "Monkey Hill" due to the abundance of monkeys. The monkeys here are under state care and are relatively docile, showing no fear of humans, making them ideal for capturing natural-looking photos.



Sri Shakti Temple

This Hindu temple tells the beautiful love story of Shiva, the god of destruction and one of the three Hindu deities, and his wife, Sati. It is known as the most beautiful structure in Malaysia. The temple entrance is crowned by a 22-meter-tall Rajagopuram (multi-tiered chapel), while the interior is adorned with 96 carved pillars depicting the 96 universal principles of Hinduism, adding to its beauty.



Romantic Firefly Tour - Firefly viewing along the beautiful Selangor River

This is a unique and fantastic experience, allowing you to see fireflies, which only live in pristine areas. The firefly tour begins at the Firefly Park, located on the banks of the Kuala Selangor River. You'll get a close-up view of the fireflies nestled in the mangrove forests along the Selangor River. The sight of these tiny, twinkling fireflies decorating the night sky is unforgettable.

Dutch Square - The start of your Malacca journey, Dutch Square

Windmill Dutch Square Melaka (also known as Windmill Dutch Square Melaka) is a central meeting place and a starting point for any Malacca adventure. The Clock Tower and Victoria Fountain are the first things you'll notice upon entering the square, and trishaws (three-wheeled bicycles) are readily available to transport travelers to tourist attractions. Also located within the square is the Christ Church, built during the Dutch colonial period. The red building, blending seamlessly with the square, is a renowned Malacca landmark. Be sure to take a commemorative photo in front of the "I LOVE MELAKA" sculpture, a signature photo spot in the square!



Fort Santiago - A fortress built to guard the Strait of Malacca

This fortress was built by the Portuguese in 1511 to defend the Straits of Malacca from the Dutch. Located at the entrance to St. Paul's Hill, the only remaining traces of the war are the fort's gate and the cannons used by the Portuguese.



Jonker Street

This is Malacca's most famous market street, always bustling with tourists, much like Bangkok's Kiosan Road. It's lined with charming cafes, craft shops, and food stalls, and various religious temples dot the streets, making it a delightful stroll.



Cheng Hoon Teng Temple - The oldest Chinese temple in Malaysia

Built in 1646 to honor Ming General Zheng He, who developed Malacca into a maritime trading powerhouse linking the East and the West, this temple is the oldest Chinese temple in Malaysia and is renowned for its construction, with all materials imported from China. The name "Cheng Hoon Teng" means "Blue Cloud," and the vibrant, diverse colors of the temple and the sight of locals praying create a unique ambiance.

Trishaws, bicycles decorated with various dolls and ornaments from roof to wheels, are a delightful mode of transportation unique to Malacca. Ride a trishaw, its rustic charm making it even more adorable, and enjoy a delightful ride through the nooks and crannies of Malacca!



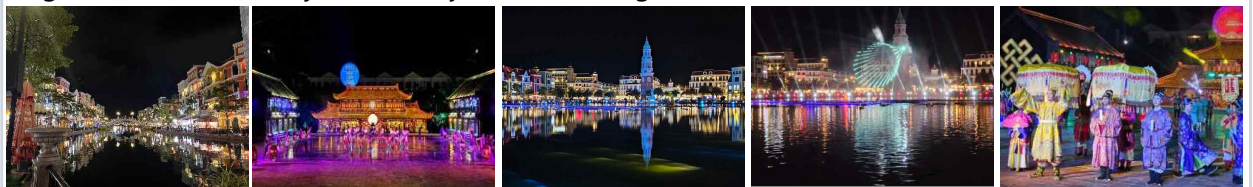

Jalan Alor Night Market - A lively night market

At night, the streets become buzzing with activity as people flock to Jalan Alor! Jalan Alor, meaning "street," is aptly named Alor. Located behind Bukit Bintang, Jalan Alor is Kuala Lumpur's signature food street, lined with open-air tables. Experience the vibrant atmosphere of locals and expats, lined with food stalls. A delicious sashimi and a cold beer at Jalan Alor Night Market will surely blow away the sweltering heat.

National Mosque - The National Mosque, a symbol of national faith

Completed in 1965, the National Mosque is the only mosque in Malaysia that allows visitors to visit its interior. A symbol of the nation's commitment to Islam, it features a modern 18-pointed star-shaped dome and a 73-meter-tall minaret. The 18 points represent Malaysia's 13 states and the five pillars of Islam. The mosque houses a prayer hall that can accommodate 8,000 people, a mausoleum, a library, and conference rooms. Shoes must be removed upon entering, and those wearing revealing clothing must borrow a robe at the entrance.

*On Fridays, only worshippers are allowed to enter, so only the exterior can be viewed.



Merdeka Square - Independence Square featuring monuments and images of Asian countries

Merdeka Square is where the Malaysian flag was first raised on August 31, 1957, following the country's liberation from British rule. Merdeka, meaning "independence," is the center of many national events and commemorative ceremonies, including the annual National Day Parade. The surrounding area, formed during the British colonial era, is home to many historically significant buildings and, as a center of independence, holds significant historical significance for locals. The orange roofs within the square mark the Royal Selangor Club, while the KL Gallery, KL Library, and Sultan Abdul Samad Building are located nearby.



KLCC Park - KLCC Park, a leisurely park in the city

KLCC Park, located next to the Petronas Twin Towers, is surrounded by tall buildings and lush greenery, making it the perfect escape from the heat. It features well-maintained walking paths for walking or jogging, and at night, you can enjoy a fountain show with vibrant lights. Its proximity to Suria KLCC also makes shopping easy, attracting many tourists seeking a relaxing escape.



Petronas Twin Towers - Kuala Lumpur's iconic twin towers

Standing 452 meters tall and boasting 88 floors, the Petronas Twin Towers, one of the world's tallest buildings, were completed in 1998. Dominating the Kuala Lumpur skyline, they are a central feature of this modern city. Built by Koreans and Japanese, one tower was built in Korea and the other in Japan, these twin towers are even more famous as a major filming location for the film "Entrapment." The Petronas Twin Towers are owned by Malaysia's largest oil company, Petronas. Constructed primarily of steel, concrete, and glass, the two towers are connected by a sky bridge. While waiting to ascend the sky bridge, the proud Samsung logo appears, a reminder of the towers' history, making you want to exclaim, "I'm Korean!" The first four floors are lined with

world-renowned brands, various shopping spaces, and lounges, making for a truly enjoyable shopping experience. The spacious plaza in front of the fountain on the first floor and the KLCC Park frequently host various performances and events, doubling the fun of the Twin Towers.
