### Seongeup Folk Village

About 8km north of Pyoseon-ri, you will find Seongeup Village at the foot of Mt. Halla. Seongeup-ri was originally the capital of Jeongui-hyeon when Jeju Island was divided into three directional divisions (1410-1914), and it is a place that preserves the characteristics of Jeju Island's old houses. Many tangible and intangible cultural heritages are collectively distributed, and the old village-style folk landscape is well preserved, so it is designated and protected as a folk village to maintain its old appearance. Here, tangible cultural heritages such as old houses, hyanggyo, old government offices, stone grandfathers, lotus mills, castle sites, and tombstones, as well as intangible cultural heritages such as folk songs, folk games, local foods, folk crafts, and Jeju dialect unique to the central mountainous region are still being passed down. Natural monuments such as zelkova and pine trees provide a glimpse into the pride of a 500-year-old capital. Seongeup Folk Village, which best preserves Jeju's thatched houses, is where you can meet the Seongeup-ri residents who actually live in Jeju's thatched houses and Jeju's traditional toilets called 'tongsi'. In particular, the old-fashioned appearance of the village's old trees, stone walls, and old castle walls shows the history of the capital city for 500 years.

### **U-do Island**

Udo Island was called Soseom from early on because it resembled a cow lying down. It is a tourist destination with natural conditions such as gentle slopes, fertile soil, abundant fishing grounds, and the eight scenic spots of Udo Island. It is a representative island of Jeju, visited by about 2 million tourists annually.

### **Jeju Traditional Market**

Dongmun Traditional Market, which has a long history, is a representative market in Jeju Island. Along with the adjacent Dongmun Traditional Fish Market, it is the core of Jeju's largest permanent market, established immediately after liberation in August 1945. Originally Jeju Island's only permanent market and center of commercial activity, this place was relocated to Jeju Island. 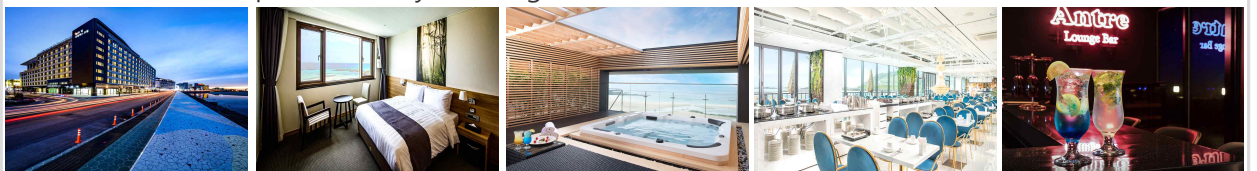
### **Hotel Check in** - Hotel style

#### **Mt.Sanbang & Yongmeori Beach or Soesokkak**

Sanbangsan Mountain, meaning 'mountain with caves,' is a mountain where Sanbangguls Temple, a temple with a small Buddha statue, is located at the foot of the mountain. According to Jeju mythology, her grandmother, Seolmundae Halmang, created this mountain by throwing a stone from the summit of Hallasan Mountain. Sanbangsan Mountain, which stands tall at 395 meters above sea level on the southwestern coast of Jeju Island, is full of rapeseed flowers in spring, creating a picturesque landscape with Sanbangsan Mountain in the background.

Yongmeori Beach is a water-volcanic rocky coast formed by the accumulation of volcanic debris erupted from three craters under the sea. The coastal cliffs look like Yongmeori ('Yongmeori') due to long-term sedimentation and erosion. The strange cliffs created by the waves are spectacular. The coastal platform next to the sea serves as a promenade. On the way down to the beach, the Hamel Monument is erected to commemorate Hamel, who drifted here.

#### **Jusangjeolli Cliff**

Daepo Columnar Joints are stone pillars formed when lava flowing from a crater rapidly cools and contracts. It is characterized by a polygonal staircase shape. These stones are 30 to 40 meters high, hexagonal in shape, and line the coast for about 1 km. The constantly crashing waves are a highlight not to be missed.



### **Lunch** – Chicken & Pizza (Shared food)

The Cliff, nestled within the Pacific Land of the Jungmun Tourist Complex on Jeju Island, serves as both a café and pub. Spanning three levels, the establishment features a diner on the first floor, a pub on the second, and a private party space on the third. It's celebrated for offering stunning views of the Jeju Sea. By day, it operates as a café, transitioning into a pub come evening. The Cliff Pizza, adorned with abalone and seafood, stands out as the signature dish. Another favorite among patrons is the Hyunmuam chicken (squid ink butter chicken), a creative dish inspired by Jeju's unique natural landscape.



#### **Yacht Tour**

Take a yacht tour of the calmest sea in Jeju Island, the Wolpyeong Coast. The most beautiful Mt. Halla, seen from the south, blocks the wind, and the breakwater-shaped Wolpyeong Coast terrain blocks big waves. Here, you can enjoy a snack, unlimited drinks, and fish cake soup. And this is a course where you can even experience sea fishing.





### ***YakCheonSa*** - Largest Temple in East Asia

Jeju Yakcheonsa Temple is the largest temple in Asia. It was originally a small hermitage called Yaksum, but it was given the name Yakcheonsa because there was a famous mineral spring nearby. This is where the tombstones of two royal couples from the Joseon Dynasty, namely King Munjong and his queen, and King Yeongchin and his queen, are enshrined. Temple stays are also provided for both locals and foreigners.

### ***Let's run park***

The Korea Racing Authority will hold a 'Reclis unveiling ceremony' to commemorate the establishment of a statue of Jeju Marquis, a patriotic hero who played an active part in the Korean War, on Oct. 26. Called a patriotic hero, 'Reclis' was a preliminary racehorse preparing for activities at the racetrack in Sinseol-dong, Seoul after liberation. However, when the Korean War broke out, the U.S. Marine Corps purchased 'Reclis' as a military horse in 1952 and put it on a mission to transport supplies to mountainous areas where vehicles were difficult to enter.

Unlike ordinary words that are sensitive to hearing, 'Reclis' did his duty silently without being surprised by the sound of the battlefield's saturation. He took the path he went once by himself, and he was so smart that he returned on his own carrying wounded soldiers on the battlefield that he received the trust and love of the U.S. Marine Corps.

We will stop by the memorial place (Let's run park) of Reclis.



### ***Cafe street with Handam Beach***

Aewol-eup, located next to the beautiful sea of Jeju, is believed to have been named 'Gaddal' in the past. Goddal is a name that combines the Jeju word 'gat', meaning coast, and 'dal', meaning moon. It is said that Aewol Port originated because it resembles a crescent moon. Follow the winding curves of the Handam Coastal Trail that connects Aewol and Gwakji. In 2009, Jeju City designated the Handam Coastal Trail as one of Jeju's 31 Hidden Scenic Areas, and many cafes and restaurants opened along the trail. Today, this route is so popular that it can hardly be called a 'hidden sight' in good faith, but it only means that more people are discovering the charms of this beautiful route.



### **The Ma Park** – admission fee & show included / any other activity is additional fee

The Ma Park", located in Jeju Island, offers the world's largest horse-themed park. They have state-of-the-art horse riding facilities for everyone from beginners to professionals as well as indoor and outdoor race tracks. They also offer a horse-riding show. The stadium for the show can accommodate 1,500 people. They also provide a snack bar, a gift shop, an exhibition hall of rare horses, horse feeding and tourism horseback riding.

The show, entitled "Oh, Goguryeo! 1,000 years of Kingdom," is presented in four acts spread out over 50 minutes. The plot follows the legend of Jumong who created the Goguryeo Kingdom.

It features about 60 professional male and female riders providing a truly spectacular display of equestrian mastery. All the performers are from Mongolia, a land known for its horsemanship, and even more impressively, these riders have competed at the famed Nadam festival.

### **Yongdoo Rock, Yongyeon Bridge**

Yongdoo Rock, located on the northern coast of downtown Jeju, is a rock estimated to be 10 meters high. It has been carved by strong winds and waves over a long period of time and resembles the shape of a dragon's head. There are many legends surrounding the rock. There is a legend that a dragon who stole precious jade from Hallasan Mountain was struck down by the mountain god's arrow. As soon as he fell, his body sank into the sea, and his head rapidly froze as he looked up at the sky. According to another legend, a white horse that dreamed of becoming a dragon and ascending to heaven was captured by a soldier and frozen on a rock.

Yongyeon is a place where sea water and fresh water meet. There is a legend that the Dragon King often sent envoys to the pond. There are eight rock walls that look like folding screens on both sides of the pond. This pond, also called Yongyeon Yabeom, is one of the 12 scenic spots of Jeongju. Yongyeon Beom refers to the beautiful sight created by the reflection of the full moon in the clear sea water of the rocky cliffs. So, many people come to the pond at night to see the beautiful night scenery.
